Life of the Church

One of the great joys of being a pastor is being present for spiritual moments in people's lives. In July, we celebrated three adults coming to the fountain of grace to be baptized, plus three additional persons who joined the church on profession of faith or transfer of membership.

When babies are baptized, it's a little different. The parents are nervous as they answer questions about raising their child in faith. The giddy grandparents are taking lots of pictures. The sponsors, or Godparents, are supportive and still wondering what their role is in all of this. The baby doesn't understand and may not appreciate the drops of water on their head and face.

When an adult chooses to come for baptism, it's a very different experience. Adults know they are choosing to make a covenant with Christ, a vow, a public statement about what they believe. Since they face the altar for the sacrament, I get to see their expressions: tears of adoration for God, the release of pain, and the welcome peace which rests over each person as they welcome the cleansing water of grace and the words of blessing.

The other part of every baptism and reception of new members is the congregation's participation with renewal of our own covenant with God and our commitment to the church. In these words of affirmation, we agree to support new persons in their faith walk, and journey with them in the ministries of the church.

This is where I wonder, how much do all these words mean to each of us. Is it all just rote responses that we read because it's on the screen and it's happening to someone else and not to us? Do our words and reaffirmations match the enthusiasm and delight of those who are pledging themselves in baptism for the first time? Or do we also feel overwhelmed and invite the Holy Spirit to ignite a new fire in us?

It is through our understanding and application of our baptism and membership vows that energy and new life is breathed into the church.

So today I ask you to read these baptism vows that the congregation makes again and focus on how these statements apply to your faith journey today.

Coloring and personalizing a bag to keep all the goodies for the week together.




